Last month, I wrote in this same space about the culture of violence which pervades our American society, made most horribly visible in the recent mass shootings. Gun violence is an almost daily element of our local news, with no sign of a let-up.

I continue to pray that our national and local leaders will move from talking to action in efforts to work toward policy changes which will achieve a lessening of our propensity to shoot one another in vast numbers. More people die on our city streets and in our homes from gunshot wounds each year than have been killed in Afghanistan and Iraq combined over all the years of those wars.

There are many sides to the issue of gun violence, or person-on-person violence, in general. Reasonable people can disagree about what makes for responsible policy. But, the reasonableness gets swamped by those who have a vested financial interest in the manufacture and distribution of firearms and those who "worship" their guns.



During the month of February, we will again experience the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 13. As you no doubt know, Lent is the six-week period leading up to the celebration of Easter. Easter is when we remember the crucifixion of Jesus and celebrate his resurrection. Crucifixion was a most cruel form of violence.

which Jesus suffered in response to his living a life utterly obedient to God's call. The church has

call. The church has traditionally taught that Jesus died taking on the sins of the world, offering those who follow him the grace of forgiveness and freedom from our own sin. And in Jesus' resurrection, we are given eternal life. We are redeemed and raised up in new life by the work of the Holy Spirit in us. Not only are the redeemed called to live lives worthy of this gift, we are called to share that redemption with the whole world. I do not know how we

can remain silent about the violence which surrounds us, if we truly are resurrection people.

We give voice to the fact that God's purpose is to bring about a remade heaven and earth. I believe that the new earth does not include violence. Granted the new world order is not complete yet. But, those of us who follow Jesus are called to live as if it is here, even now. For me that includes doing what we can to eradicate the disease of violence where we can. I

urge you to support measures which can do that. No law is perfect, no policy completely successful.

But, if we can stop a single instance of violence through better control of weapons availability; through improved mental healthcare for the deranged; and through our own actions as Christians showing God's love in the world, we will be at least one step closer to "Thy Kingdom come."


