I'm writing today in partnership with Brenda Swindle, your super awesome, utterly amazing Business Manager. As you know, Brenda has been doing a great job of "holding down the fort" as FUPC transitions to new pastoral leadership while seeking to maintain regular operations and keep things feeling relatively normal. It helps all of us to have a sense of normalcy in the midst of change, right?

This desire for something that feels normal during a transitional time may also be the reason I was asked to write to you today: Now, as in the past, hearing from me is "normal" when the pastor is away. I've had the opportunity to worship with you when your former pastor was on vacation/ sabbatical, and I will be with you during Holy Week this year as you await the arrival of your interim pastor, and eventually, your new called pastor. It is an exciting time to be at FUPC, and a privilege for me to walk with

you through this time of transition.

These days are certainly a season of walking, and waiting, and preparing,

not just for the people of FUPC, but for all of God's people. The Lenten journey calls us to

prepare our hearts and minds, spending time in contemplation of what is to come. It invites us to think deeply and honestly about what Christ's sacrifice means for

us, and to prepare for the reality of the Resurrection.

The reality of the Resurrection is that Christ didn't stay in the grave. Of this we have complete confidence. But I wonder if we ever think about this part of the story... his followers did not stay at the empty tomb either. They got up. They kept moving. And they told the story of what they had seen. It was challenging, and filled with uncertainty. But they did it, because that's what God's people do. They bear witness to the Christian story.

That's the challenge for us too. The month of March offers us opportunities to continue that season of walking and waiting and preparing, both as the people of FUPC, and as the people of God. Lent will soon be followed by Palm Sunday and



all the events of Holy Week, culminating with a glorious Easter morning celebration of the Resurrection.

The month of March also offers

us the opportunity to keep moving forward, to keep being God's people in this place and in this community, and to do all of this in the midst of a transition, always bearing witness to the Christian story. After all, that's what God's people do. It's completely normal.

In the coming days, please look for every opportunity to join your brothers and sisters in Christ as we take this journey together.
