"Lent forces us to get real with our mortal humanity."



I recently heard, albeit third hand, a story about the famous jazz trumpeter Wynton Marsalis. He was performing a concert in an intimate venue. While he was trumpeting a song someone's cell

phone rang with a distinctive musical ringtone. Trust me, I have been in this spot! No one else wants to hear my ringtone! As the person panicked to silence the phone an awkward silence filled the hall. Even Marsalis paused in his playing, but only for just a moment. Fairly quickly he began to play the tune which was the ringtone. Can you imagine that scene? He played it repetitively, and in different keys. But the real surprise occurred when he transitioned from that tune back to his original song which he was playing when the phone rang. It was seamless and effortless. No one expected what they heard. The moment was redeemed.

I think this story points to our experience of God's presence in our lives. Through Christ, God redeems the brokenness and messiness of our lives and makes it something beautiful. We don't always understand how. In fact, rarely do we

understand how. Yet, this is the hope for which we long, hoping beyond hope, as Paul wrote. Lent readies us for the unexpected ways that God moves in and through our lives. Easter affirms the victory of

that delivering presence. As we let go, and trust, God lifts us up into something new and amazing, something unexpected. Perhaps this is the essence of the gospel that we experience in our lives – God redeeming and making something beautiful of our mess.

What is the hope that lies before us? It is that God through the death and resurrection of Christ will make something beautiful out of our

situation. It may not be what we expect, or even what we would want, but it will be what God intends to further God's kingdom. This is true for our lives and families and relationships; it is true for our church. What will become of the budding relationship

between Iglesia Presbiteriana Emmanuel and our church?

I hope that we can be open to God's redemptive movement in our midst that might be unexpected and surprising. Resurrection make us new. However, resurrection does not

return us to the old, it moves us forward to the new. Life and death and life, these are the realities of our existence. Lent forces us to get real with our mortal humanity. Yet, this frees us to be open to the deliverance of God, and resurrection, however, unexpected.
