What do you want? Last week, most us wanted heat and water, and warmer temperatures. This week we got warmer temperatures! However, I still want

water! As we watch the images stream before us, apparently there are many who have a similar want – or is this a need?

To want is to will, to desire. What is your will? What is your desire? Barbara and I have a strong desire to receive the COVID vaccination. We often contrast our wants with needs. We are told needs are necessary and worthy; we are told wants are not necessary and excess. As humans, we actually do need water. Yet, we also want water. The vaccination also seems to be a need.

Jesus acknowledged that we have wants. "If any want to become my followers, . . ." Some wants are good; To want is to will, to desire. What is your will? What is your desire?

some wants hold us in bondage. Sometimes, our wants express our desire to have control in life. Our lived experiences, however, reveal how allusive actual control is in our daily living. Just as tempting, is to see control as a need – allowing us to experience meaning, hope, joy, deliverance, healing, comfort, refuge, strength, allowing us to be a part of changing the world for the good. These are things we desire, we want, and we need.

What do you want? What do you desire? Into this discussion of wants, Jesus raises the need of self-denial and cross-bearing. These are not easy. To deny self is to place the priorities, purposes and path of Jesus in place of our own. To bear the cross is to be willing to experience the consequences of faithful living. To follow Jesus is to travel to unknown destinations that promise to be both dangerous and life-giving. I can't



This year marks the 50th anniversary for **Metrocrest Services** assisting individuals living in Carrollton, Addison, Farmers Branch, Coppell and Dallas (75287) in Denton County.

Last year **Metrocrest Services** provided: 2,207,048 meals to neighbors experiencing food insecurity, 1,429 households received emergency rent or lodging assistance, provided rides for seniors and adults with disabilities, 6,030 home delivered meals to seniors, and 146 minor home repairs to keep seniors in their homes. 
