Dear Friends,

We have just completed the cycle of the Church year known as Lent,

with the exciting celebration of the Risen Lord in Easter. We continue in what is known as Eastertide until the day of Pentecost (June 7 this year) when we remember the birth of the church.

During the six weeks of Lent, 18 to 20 of us had a wonderful time of prayer, fellowship, and collaboration on Wednesday nights. During a *Time for Listening* we got to know one another better and we worked together on finding out what is most important to us.

One of the themes which came up over and over was the idea from Isaiah 56:7, 8 that "... my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples. Thus says the Lord God, who gathers the outcasts of Israel..." This passage prompted us to ask the question, "What would it be like if Faith United Presbyterian Church saw itself as that prophetic and inclusive vision for God's House?"

Certainly we, the people of Faith United pray now regularly. We gather for prayer on Sundays. We gather to pray in our women's circles. We pray for those we know who have need. You have received the email notices when special prayers are requested in particular need. And we do not collectively see the times when we, individually, bow to pray. But, what about offering our space and our presence to be a house of

prayer for the community around us? After all, Isaiah says "... all people..." If we seriously took this on, it might call us to include

some people we might not include otherwise.

There were some thoughts and ideas put forth to be further fleshed out about how we might welcome the community to be a part of the prayer life at FUPC. Not necessarily for the benefit or growth of the church, but as a way to make the church a more open and inclusive place for those not already here to find a place to pray in whatever form they might choose.

We are already learning some things about the different ways people pray by being with our brothers and sisters of Church of South India—Dallas. That is a great start. Someone thought of

an idea about how we might offer people a place to request intercessory prayers, through the church's Facebook page. And another person envisioned a prayer request board in the building for those who wish to leave notes requesting special prayer, etc, etc. There are probably many more ways for this idea to take shape.

Ways that have not been thought of before.

Prayer is the medium through which all mis-

sion is conceived and implemented. It is through prayer that the Holy Spirit empowers us to go out into the community showing God's love and goads us into action. It is through prayer that the Holy Spirit teaches us how to follow Jesus.

This *Time for Listening* was a very special spiritual time for me personally. I want to thank the group for their willingness to walk the journey of Lent together. We just got a start at developing some ideas. More work must be done to set a new direction. Listen for more opportunities to talk and dream together.



# Spotlight on Lorna Acker!

In keeping with our desire to enrich the relationships at our church, we have chosen Lorna Acker, a long time member to spotlight for the month of May.

A fortunate thing about my conversation with Lorna was that I got to meet with her in her beautiful home in north Dallas. She and her husband, Charlie, moved there 44 years ago,

when it was just being built in that area. She told me the company that was constructing the house went bankrupt and left it undone. So she and Charles counted it a very good deal and rolled up their sleeves to finish the job. They enlisted the help of the neighborhood children to help clear the yard. It took them about a year to complete the house and yard with Charlie doing a lot of the construction. Lorna told me she had found a man who could "fix things"!

One of the other things that her husband, Charlie, a Braniff pilot, did for Lorna was to snatch her away from her home in the Northwest U.S. and bring her to Dallas. She considers this a fortunate move for her, and the rest of us consider this a fortunate thing for Dallas. Actually, this gregarious guy noticed her while she was on a vacation with some of her girlfriends with whom she shared an apartment in San Francisco. Having access to very good transportation, Charlie managed to be where she was as often as he could. She was living there and working as a secretary for a company that owned commercial cafeterias (like Luby's) up and down the west coast. The foods and nutrition degree she earned at Oregon State University served her well in that position and continues to serve her well in the areas where she volunteers at this time in her life.

Life for Lorna began in The Dalles, Oregon on the edge of the Columbia River. Her family owned a large wheat ranch, but, like many other families, they lost it during the Great Depression. Following the loss of their ranch, the family moved to Portland. They spent summers up in the mountains at a cabin and eventually moved there for her father's work as a forest ranger. She was the only daughter, and also the youngest child, of three siblings. During the years she lived in

the mountains, she learned to ski, to climb mountains and fish. She lived with her parents and two older brothers, and many cousins, aunts and uncles who joined them from time to time at the cabin in the mountains. As a young girl, she stayed busy with her dog and enjoyed the activities of Campfire Girls. During this time, her older brother went to fight in WWII and was killed in battle. The grief her family felt was shared by so many other families during those years and she remembers her

mother's activities with Gold Star Mothers group.

After marrying Charlie and moving to Dallas, they had 3 children, all boys, who are now grown and married. Two of her sons live in Carrollton, and the other lives in South Carolina and is father of her grandchildren. The boys all grew up attending Ridgeview Presbyterian Church with Lorna and Charlie.

Lorna met and made friends with many women who made up the Braniff auxiliary that provided a rich social life and the opportunity for her to become involved in the community. The auxiliary raised money for scholarships for college senior women who were going on for master's degrees in speech and hearing. She still finds an outlet for her charitable work now at North Dallas Shared Ministries where she has volunteered for the last 15 years. She and a group of other members also continue the activities of the "Starboard Stitchers" which began as a ministry of Ridgeview Presbyterian. This group made quilts for the Ronald McDonald House in the past and now makes stuffed animals for the babies and toddlers who come to NDSM for medical care. She also takes part in water aerobics at a local YMCA. She thinks that taking good care of her health, and having hobbies, like her sewing, has given her the skills for living well. She values the various groups she has contact with as they offer her a variety of ideas and activities as well as the friendships.

She also enjoys the attention and generosity of her sons and their families who are her greatest joy. She says loving them and being available without interfering in their lives is wisdom she has gained and employs to maintain these relationships.

# News from Grace Presbytery about recent tornadoes



## Responding to recent Tornadoes

Severe thunderstorms moved across the Central and Southern United States April 25 through April 28, 2014. Strong winds, large hail and at least 30 tornadoes were reported.

Mayflower and Vilonia, two towns located just northwest of Little Rock, Arkansas, sustained the most damage from the storm. At least 16 fatalities have been reported in Arkansas. Fatalities were also reported in Oklahoma, Iowa and Kansas.

PDA has been in contact with mid councils in the affected areas, and One Great Hour of Sharing funds and funds designated for disaster response in the United States are available for immediate disbursement. National Response Team (NRT) members are enroute to Arkansas



# **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance**

at the request of the Arkansas Presbytery to offer support in assessing the damage and developing a response to these storms.

PDA has no report of Presbyterian Churches affected and will support the ecumenical, interfaith, and community disaster response efforts as well as the response by mid-councils through Presbyterian Churches in neighboring communities.
