From the Pastor

We need to know and to live the truth of resurrection in our lives and in the life of the church.



Easter is not over! The holy season of Easter continues until Pentecost (June 9) and invites us to dig deeper into the meaning of Jesus' resurrection – not just as a historical event in the life

of Jesus of Nazareth to which we assent intellectually. Resurrection is not just a mysterious event that once happened long ago. We need to know and to live the truth of resurrection in our lives and in the life of the church.

However, understanding resurrection for our everyday lives, here and now, in this place and time, is not always clear. Yet, the story of the early church in Scripture speaks of an empowered fellowship of believers that left the confines and security of their upper room to go into their world to make disciples of all nations, and to announce good news to the poor, proclaim release to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the time of God's love and grace. It was the resurrection that changed everything for a group of overwhelmed, discouraged, fearful,

and powerless followers of Jesus. So, the resurrection does for us as well.

Years ago, I saw a Facebook post from a church conference that said, "most of our churches have more memories than dreams." This quote is fascinating and intriguing. It is always easier to reminisce about yesterday than it is to navigate through the travails and challenges of today and tomorrow. Doing and being church was a lot easier when people came to us. Not too many people are coming to us these days, and it might seem that all we have left are memories.

However, resurrection allows us to dare to dream – not just for our own lives, but for the church. Yet, we do not dream disengaged from reality, we dream God's dream and actively engage in God's reality! Resurrection announces that God is not through with humanity; God is not through with humanity; God is not through with the church – God is not through with our church! A new day lies ahead, even for those whose bones are brittle and whose souls are tired. God is not through with the people of our neighborhood and community! But, how do we move forward in this new day? First let's give ourselves permission to dream. Dreaming is risky, because dreams invite a new way of being and doing. Second, let's ask this basic question – how do the people of our neighborhood/community know that we love them? Third, if people are not coming to us to be loved, then we will need to go to them. Fourth, we are not left to our own resolve and resources – the Holy Spirit fills us, flows through us, and surrounds around us!

The Book of Acts tells the story of the Holy Spirit filling, flowing through, and surrounding the early church. Over the coming weeks and months, we will listen to these stories as we seek to discern the Spirit's movement in our lives, homes, relationships, church, and neighborhood.

Easter is not over! Let's keep our memories – but let's do some dreaming and see where and to whom it takes us!


