#### From the Pastor

The season of pandemic continues as we move into June. Anybody else tired of this new reality? Oh, how I miss being with each of you!

I have been reflecting on the story of the

Israelites in their journey through the wilderness. I think we can view this time as a wilderness journey – it sure feels like it. They journeyed through the wilderness of Sin; we journey through the wilderness of pandemic. Let's hope our journey is shorter than their 40-year trek!

Their wilderness experience was a time of formation and preparation as the people of God. They were not led on the quickest path; there was not a specific route; they encountered threats and danger; they experienced uncertainty and doubt. In the wilderness it can be hard to sort out perceptions and reality, and anxiety can rise quickly. Anxiety can lead us to grasp for control of a situation.

Anxiety can easily become panic.

There were times when the Israelites allowed their anxiety to steer them astray as they hungered, thirsted, complained, and sought false assurance in a golden idol.

Within their story is a tension of trust – trusting God in the midst of the reality of chaos, uncertainty and challenge. God was steadfastly present with them, providing and caring for them in their journey. Indeed, the stories often indicate that providential care came in unexpected ways. God was also leading and guiding them to a new place of promise. While they voiced desires to return to what was, God promised something new, which they did not yet totally understand.

Can we trust God in this reality of pandemic? Can we view this time of wilderness as a time of formation and preparation? Is there something new that lies before us? All of us are certainly anxious to get back to what we thought was normal, including inperson church activities. Yet, the quickest route is not always the

wisest route, especially when it comes to God. All of us have a range of emotions and thoughts, full of uncertainty, question and concern. A wilderness journey is more often than not a marathon, not a sprint.

God is present in our midst. There is the reality of God's care and provision. The Spirit is leading us in love, compassion, perseverance, and wisdom. The church is not closed, even though we choose to worship remotely in the interest of love and safety. We are still glorifying God, growing disciples, and meeting the needs of our neighbors – all be it differently. Are we open to the unexpected, as God forms and prepares us?

Let's continue to be in prayer. Stay connected with each other and your neighbors. Choose love, kindness, compassion. Advocate for peace and justice.

## Faith United Presbyterian Church and Iglesia Presbiteriana Emmanuel Join us for Camp-In-A-Box VBS 2020!

Camp-in-a-Box brings the fun of a camp or VBS program to your doorstep! The box is designed with the elementary camper in mind, grades K-6th. Each box provides 5 days' worth of activities that are screen-free, encourage outdoor activity, and minimize demands on parents or grandparents.

The theme for this box is: **Deep Roots, New Leaves**. In their weeklong experience, campers will discover that God is always doing a new thing. While God offers stability and safety, like a tree's deep roots, God is also working for good in each new moment, like a tree sprouting new leaves.



Campers will look at God's creation of the world, how God shapes us like clay, how we can have new life as we are renewed, how God is still doing new things today, and how we are invited into God's continuing creation.

#### What's in the Box?

- ♦ Each Camp-In-A-Box comes with 5 day bags.
- Each day will have a Guide, with a scripture, questions, a prayer, and a checklist of camp activities for the camper to complete throughout the day.
- Two of these activities will have additional instructions on Cards the One Square Yard (where they will visit the same spot outdoors each day) and the Weeklong Project Card (a painting project they'll add to each day).
- In addition, each day will have an Optional Family Challenge Card, with theme related activities for the whole family, Table Talk questions for a meal-time discussion, and a Family Prayer.
- The box will include a focus object for each day, as well as supplies needed to complete the daily activities (for example, the painting canvas).

How Much does it cost? Boxes are available for a donation you feel comfortable contributing.
