Change in Medication Collection

The Faith Community Nurses will no longer be able to collect your outdated medications. The U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency used to partner with pharmacies and law enforcement to take back drugs twice and year. We have been collecting here at the church for your convenience and taking the medications to the police department on the appointed days. As a result of a policy change, law enforcement and pharmacies must provide safe and convenient disposal of meds for individuals. This leaves out other entities such as churches. Having medications on church property without a written prescription is in violation of the law as written and we don't have a way to dispose of them. So, don't look for the big tan container beside the Resource Room door anymore.

Please do continue to get rid of your outdated medications by taking them to the Farmers Branch Police Dept. in the lobby of the Farmers Branch Justice Center, 3723 Valley View Lane, between 8 am and 5 pm Mondays through Fridays.

Items they will accept: prescription patches, medications, ointments, over-the -counter medications, vitamins, samples and pet meds.



Unacceptable items: needles, medications from businesses, churches, or clinics, thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, inhalers, lotions or liquids or aerosol cans.
