

From the Pastor

“Every day we can celebrate our true freedom in Christ!”



There is great awkwardness to the celebration of freedom during COVID-19 and the intense racial protests and discussions. Often, we can put aside differences and

challenges for a few days of fireworks, parades, celebrations, picnics, and outdoor fun as we mark Independence Day. This year is different. Most parades are cancelled; public celebrations scaled back significantly. What does it mean to celebrate justice, liberty and the pursuit of happiness in days when so many voices long ignored or dismissed are expressing the pain of generations of injustice? How do we celebrate freedom when a pandemic greatly limits how we live in these days of uncertainty, anxiety, and fear?

Some years ago, William H. Willimon, a retired Methodist pastor, questioned the quality of freedom in our land. He predicted that “our age shall be known, not as the age of freedom, but

as the age of anxiety. We are anxious about many things: having enough money, having good enough health, being secure and safe.” These words still speak ominously. Have we accepted a yoke of fear, with its burden of anxiety?

Jesus used the imagery of a yoke to teach about the kingdom of God. Yokes are big, bulky, and heavy. A yoke is a familiar symbol of burden bearing, oppression and subjugation. Yokes were laid upon necks and shoulders of oxen. This allowed those beasts of burden to be better controlled for maximum efficiency to accomplish difficult tasks at hand.

Jesus offered rest to a weary people struggling under great burdens. Then he offered his yoke – a yoke he described as easy with a burden that is light. Jesus still makes this offer to us in these days of COVID-19 and racial unrest, and all of the other burdens we carry. The implication is clear, true freedom is found in the yoke of Christ – free from the burdens of fear and anxiety, free for a

life of loving God and loving others, free to glorify God, grow disciples, and meet the needs of our neighbors.

We can look forward to celebrating Independence Day in grand patriotic style next year. Every day we can celebrate our true freedom in Christ!

In this freedom, choose love and kindness, compassion and care. Seek to make peace and pursue justice. Stay connected to each other and your neighbors.

Unfortunately, the recent spikes in COVID-19 in our area make it unwise to return to in-person worship. If you haven't watched the service online since we upgraded the video equipment you will be greatly surprised and pleased. I know the quality of the sound was not good before – but now, it is great! I urge you to give it another try this weekend.

Faith United Presbyterian Church and Iglesia Presbiteriana Emmanuel Join us for Camp-In-A-Box VBS 2020!

Camp-in-a-Box brings the fun of a camp or VBS program to your doorstep! The box is designed with the elementary camper in mind, grades K-6th. Each box provides 5 days' worth of activities that are screen-free, encourage outdoor activity, and minimize demands on parents or grandparents.

The theme for this box is: **Deep Roots, New Leaves**. In their weeklong experience, campers will discover that God is always doing a new thing. While God offers stability and safety, like a tree's deep roots, God is also working for good in each new moment, like a tree sprouting new leaves.

Campers will look at God's creation of the world, how God shapes us like clay, how we can have new life as we are renewed, how God is still doing new things today, and how we are invited into God's continuing creation.

What's in the Box?

- ◆ Each Camp-In-A-Box comes with 5 day bags.
- ◆ Each day will have a Guide, with a scripture, questions, a prayer, and a checklist of camp activities for the camper to complete throughout the day.
- ◆ Two of these activities will have additional instructions on Cards - the One Square Yard (where they will visit the same spot outdoors each day) and the Weeklong Project Card (a painting project they'll add to each day).
- ◆ In addition, each day will have an Optional Family Challenge Card, with theme related activities for the whole family, Table Talk questions for a meal-time discussion, and a Family Prayer.
- ◆ The box will include a focus object for each day, as well as supplies needed to complete the daily activities (for example, the painting canvas).

How Much does it cost? Boxes are available for a donation you feel comfortable contributing.
