#### **FUPC Blood Drive**

Summer is a critical time of shortage for the blood banks, so this is an opportunity to give the gift of life. On August 31 at 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the American Red Cross will be here to take blood donations.

Health screeners from the Red Cross will talk with you about your health and your medications to make sure the donation is safe for you and for the recipients. They keep your health information confidential.

Basically you must be 17 years old, (there is no upper age limit), weigh at least 110 pounds, and not have donated blood in the last 56 days.

## Kay McLellan, R.N.

The Red Cross depends on people like us to help them help others. Many medical conditions do not prevent you from donating blood. The best way to find out if you qualify is to talk to a Red Cross staff member. If you like, you can call I-800-RED CROSS to discuss your concerns. Prior to the donation

day, you will have an opportunity to schedule an appointment time for your donation with Kay McLellan or Dottie Cogar.




## Presbyterian Women

A lot is happening at NDSM this summer. Besides our normal emergency assistance with rent, utilities, and food plus medical and dental clinics, continuing tax assistance and ESL classes, there are

several special programs. Saturday, June 8<sup>th</sup> an immunization fair was held from 8:30 am till 2:00 pm. As of June 3, applications for school supplies and school uniforms began being accepted. Uniforms will be distributed from August 19<sup>th</sup> through 23<sup>rd</sup> (volunteers for 3 hour morning or afternoon shifts are needed.) School supplies will be distributed Monday, August 26<sup>th</sup>. Last year, nearly 3000 DISD children benefitted from these programs. In cooperation with our volunteering at Cabell School, the Administrative Assistant, Principal and Counselor are all aware of these programs now.

On the medical front, we are blessed to have Martha Cuellar, a Parkland outreach coordinator, at NDSM for 4 dates in the upcoming months to help provide information and help families apply for Medicaid. NDSM has also been selected to be a partner with Be Covered Texas, a Blue Cross Blue Shield of



Texas initiative to help people understand the changes needed with the upcoming activation of the Affordable Care Act. In addition to this, NDSM submitted an application to Texas A&M University,

Commerce - School of Social Work and was approved to have 2 MSW candidates on site to help clients and patients learn about the Affordable Care Act and the on-line enrollment process.

Volunteers are always needed in the Emergency Aid area and Medical Clinic. If you have 3 hours either every week or every other week that you would be willing to give to this worth-while outreach of our church, call 214-358-8787 or go online to ndsm.org.

Donations are always welcome also. Last year, Faith United gave only \$100 as a congregation from the Tuesday Morning Circle, but this year we will be giving \$800 plus what the Tuesday Morning Circle gives. Individuals in the congregation gave a total of \$2490, 753 hours of volunteer time, and 31 bags of food. I hope we can increase that all around.
