# We are a Matthew 25 church!



The Session of our church has accepted the Presbyterian Church (USA) invitation to follow Jesus' teachings in Matthew 25:31 -46 by becoming active

disciples and making a difference in our community and the world. Our church, going back into the histories of Covenant and Ridgeview, has a long history of faithfulness. That story continues through our engagement with Metrocrest, North Dallas Shared Ministry, Project Transformation, monthly community breakfasts, VBS, vibrant music ministry, among other ministries. The story will also continue through this bold vision.

As part of our Matthew 25 commitment, we pledge to embrace one of three areas of focus. At this time the Session feels called to embrace:

Building congregational vitality by deepening and energizing our faith and growing as joyful leaders and disciples actively engaged with our community as we share the gospel of lesus Christ in word and deed. The other two areas of focus are poverty and racism. As we engage with our community I am sure we will also address poverty and racism.

So, how do we build congregational vitality? Connecting to our neighbors is essential to building congregational vitality. As we look at our neighbors around the church the demographic numbers become very real. Our neighborhood is roughly 60% Hispanic, and, that figure is growing.

A few months ago, Grace Presbytery invited our church and Iglesia Emmanuel to begin discernment discussions about how the two churches can partner in multiracial ministry in our multiracial neighborhood. Iglesia Emmanuel is a Hispanic Presbyterian church in Dallas. Leaders from our church and leaders from Iglesia Emmanuel have met regularly since May. Our discussion has been Spirit blessed. At this point there are many more questions than answers. Central to the discussion is looking at Iglesia Emmanuel being housed in our facility. I am excited about the prospects of partnership with Iglesia Emmanuel! I don't know how, when, where, or what. The continuing discussions will reveal the Spirit's guidance for us on these questions. However, why seems clear to me. As we pray and think about engaging our multiracial community with the gospel of Jesus Christ in word and deed it is important to fully explore the possibilities of this potential partnership.

Jesus calls for us to love God, love others, and make disciples. We affirm that our call is to glorify God, grow disciples, and meet the needs of our neighbors. I look forward to discovering what God is up to in us, through us, and around us!

I also encourage you to be in prayer for VBS, Aug 5-9. It is not too late to volunteer to help! It is going to be a great week of ministry!
