If it is fall, it must be time to talk stewardship. However, that seems daunting to me. I'm the new guy, and let's be honest, what can I say any different from prior

stewardship discussions. Sometimes it seems that stewardship is simply a case of you having something the church needs and me convincing you to give it to the church. But, stewardship is not fundraising. Budgets, pledges, and tithing will be discussed, yet, there is something far more basic about stewardship.

Merriam-Webster defines stewardship as I) the office, duties, and obligations of a steward, 2) the conducting, supervising, or managing of something; especially: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care. All that we call "ours," is actually the Lord's. God entrusts us with time, talents and treasures, all of which serve to further the mission of God.

The creation stories and Christ's coming into the world are a

summons to faithful stewardship. Stewardship is descriptive of the being - the very life - of God's people. gives us a new vision of God's purpose and of our calling as the people of God. This vision sustains us with hope in good times and bad and calls forth our gratitude and the best we can offer of life and treasure to make the vision a reality.

Our financial stewardship serves as a barometer of faithfulness to God's purpose. God has plans for us, plans for our welfare, to give a future with hope. It is time to follow Jesus into our future. Let's continue to respond in the faithfulness that has defined our church for generations as we commit to give our tithe to the mission of God!


