## From the Pastor

## Continue to choose love, compassion and kindness.



Sunday, November I, after having turned our clocks back one hour, we turn the calendar forward to November – November I, All Saints' Day. All Saints' Day

began as a way to mark the anniversaries of the deaths of martyrs — their birthdays as saints through the completion of their baptism. Soon there were so many martyrs that it was difficult to give them all their due. All Saints' Day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, remembered and forgotten, known and unknown. It has been celebrated on November 1 since the ninth century.

In our Reformed tradition, the emphasis of this festival is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, we also give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of believers in this and every age. Sunday is also the time to give thanks for those from our community of faith

who have died in the past year, having moved to the church triumphant.

I think of all the saints who have come alongside me on my journey to nurture and mentor me. Sunday School teachers who faithfully taught the stories of the Bible. Youth leaders who persevered through my immaturity to spark embers of faith and call. Pastors who preached, taught and prayed, and taught me to pray. Older adults who mentored and encouraged by investing time in a young buck's life. Friends who formed a community of unconditional welcome and grace. Leaders who set an example as they trusted in the Spirit's guidance. Covenant brothers and sisters who joined me in prayer, held me accountable in love, and demonstrated the faithfulness of God.

Our lives of faith have been and continue to be formed and shaped by all the saints. We do not live in isolation. We are connected to who have come before us, to those who are journeying with us, and to those who will come after us. To whom are

you called to be a mentor? This is the great multitude we call the church, the church on earth and the church triumphant, in which we are included, as God works out his good purpose in us, through us, and around us.

All Saints' Day points us to the faithfulness of God throughout all generations. In the victory of Christ the Lamb, hope is made real for the wilderness journey that continues. Even in the eye of the storm, we are able to commit ourselves to God's mission and ministry in the coming year as we dedicate our financial commitment. As the saints have done before us, and as those will do who come after us, we respond to the call of Christ to love God with all our hearts, souls, and minds, and, to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Continue to choose love, compassion and kindness. Make peace, do justice, hunger and thirst for righteousness. Stay connected to each other.
