As I write this article for the December edition of Words of Faith, I am also preparing my

sermon for Christ the King Sunday, which is next Sunday November 23. Christ the King Sunday is the last Sunday of the current church liturgical year. The next Sunday, November 2, is the first Sunday of Advent, which begins our new church year. The sermon text for Christ the King is from the last part of Matthew 25, the sheep and the goats story. Jesus told this story as a way to describe the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. Basically it says that the way one is able to tell who has taken seriously the coming of the Kingdom is whether they live a life of generosity, compassion and love for the "least of these," those who are the marginalized. The story predicts that those who see the face of God in the hungry, thirsty, the sick, the naked and the imprisoned by meeting their needs will be shown to be part of the Kingdom. Those who do not recognize God in these marginalized ones, will be shown to not be part of the Kingdom. And it is not, as some

say, that compassion is shown in order to get "on board the bus," so to speak. But, those who just naturally show generosity and love will be revealed to be participants in the Reign of Christ as King.

This time of Advent is a time of waiting and preparing ourselves for the arrival of God in Jesus Christ. Often in the days leading up to Christmas, we are bombarded in our mail boxes with catalogs showing us what extravagant things we are to buy for those around us. But, just as much we receive reminders from charitable groups asking us to take part in their ministries of compassion. Or, we hear about local groups which help with food drives or other institutionalized giving to meet human need. To my way of thinking, getting ready for Christmas should include both shopping for gifts for those close to us. But it should, just as much or more,

include seeking out opportunities to see Jesus in the faces of those in need either through

> direct face-to-face encounters with the needy or giving to those ministries that reach out to the needy.

In the mad rush to have the "best Christmas ever!!" with our family and friends, please remember

those in need. In them you will see the face of Christ. Go with the group to Austin Street Centre or the Salvation Army to help serve a meal. Or, go to Scottish Rite Hospital to volunteer. Or, send a check to Habitat for Humanity or Heifer Project. Send a donation to Presbyterian Childrens' Homes and Services. Or, visit someone in the hospital or jail. There are many ways to prepare ourselves to receive the Christ-child. We might even see him on the street corner holding a sign.

Outreach & Evangelism




The Outreach Committee will hold another Community Breakfast on Dec. 13 between 8-10am. All are invited to stop by and share some
