Beginning the first Sunday in December, the church will be in the season of the year we refer to as

Advent. The word Advent comes from the Latin word "Adventus" which means "coming" or "arrival." It is a time of waiting, and watching, and preparing for the arrival of our Lord. It is about looking back in the past to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Christ child. But it is also a time of looking to the future as we await the second coming of Jesus who will come to make his perfect kingdom of peace, justice, and righteousness complete. Until that time comes, scripture tells us that we are to remain vigilant, watching, and waiting so that we are not caught by surprise.

Most of us prepare for Christmas but the concern I share with most ministers is that we spend most of our time preparing, not for a return of Jesus, but for fulfilling the demands of the season. We have presents to purchase and wrap, parties to attend, and trees to decorate. We have Christmas cards to address and mail, and lots of cookies to bake. Most of our

congregation are well beyond the age of having to put bicycles together, but that doesn't mean we don't have grandchildren to purchase for or even great grandchildren. The focus can be on preparing for Santa Claus rather than for Jesus. Mind you, I have nothing against Santa Claus, but if gifts and parties and baking cookies are the sum total of our Advent preparation, then we've

missed the boat on what the Advent season is all about.

On the other hand, there are lots of ways we can prepare for the coming of the Messiah during this

Advent season. We can begin by taking a good look at ourselves. Do our attitudes need adjusting? Are there grudges we need to get rid of, or people we need to reconcile with? Have we been too quick to judge certain people? Are there ways in which we can help others either through the church or some other volunteer organization? Can we share what we have so there is less suffering in the world? Can we devote more time to prayer and Bible study?

I have another suggestion concerning how you might be able to prepare yourself for Advent. Consider joining us on Tuesday, November 28<sup>th</sup> at 11 am and throughout the Advent season for a Bible study that

focuses on Advent Themes in the four gospels.
Specifically, we will look at the origins of Jesus in each gospel; Who is Jesus?
Where did he come from?
And how does this affect how we live our Christian life today? Even if you receive this notice late and

only have time to join us for a couple of sessions, this is the kind of Bible study you can join in on by attending any Tuesday in December up until Christmas. You'll only need a Bible and a notebook that you will receive as your curriculum.

Jesus is coming, and Jesus said no one knows the day or the hour of his return. It's OK to prepare for Santa Claus, but let's not forget to prepare for Jesus as well. Have a Merry Christmas!


This means they were going to hike the entire distance at one time. On October 23, 2017, they completed this adventure of 2190 miles ending in Maine.
