### From the Pastor

## This kind of wilderness lays us bare.



When I need a mental or, spiritual break, I will often picture myself on the beach at 17<sup>th</sup> Street in Newport Beach, California. I hear the surf, of which I body surfed

many times. I feel the grains of sand between my toes. The sea breeze washes over me with refreshing and familiar scents. Peace and comfort, joy and hope fill my soul. Can peace and comfort, joy and hope, be found in the wilderness?

I am reminded that when we speak of wilderness, biblically, we are not speaking about white sand beaches or pristine forest havens, or great canyons or mountain peaks, or any other idyllic and serene settings. The wilderness of the Bible is harsh and austere, bleak and inhospitable. Water and food are scarce. Loneliness and isolation lurk. Trails are not established. Uncertainty and confusion, struggle and death are ever-present. The wilderness of Scripture isn't a

place we choose to go. Sometimes, we're taken there against our will — illness, loss, trauma, hardship, injustice, evil, COVID. Sometimes we end up there when our careful plans fail, when someone betrays our trust, when a beloved person dies, when the faith we've practiced so routinely, suddenly dries up.

This kind of wilderness lays us bare. In this wilderness we must contend with our own powerlessness; illusions of self-sufficiency fall apart fast. The wilderness would have us acknowledge our utter

vulnerability. In the wilderness, we have no choice but to wait and watch as if our lives depend upon God showing up. Advent.

It is in this wilderness setting, the wilderness in which we find ourselves, that Isaiah says the Word of God comes, as God's Word speaks tenderly to us of comfort and hope, peace and joy. The message of the prophet is clear, things are

terrible now, but take comfort – there is a tomorrow.

The Scripture passages we hear on this Second Sunday in Advent assume we are wandering in the wilderness. Yet, comfort awaits. Here is your God, who comes to gather, feed and carry!

I hope to see you each Sunday, II:00 am, either through YouTube or Facebook for worship as we continue our Advent journey. Invite family and friends to tune in.
