Grief and the season of holidays do not go together well. For many people their experience of December is that of a blue Christmas rather than a dreamy white Christmas. The pain of

grief is real and is seldom comforted by superficial Christmas songs, temporary holiday cheer, or shallow goodwill towards all. Retail therapy only goes so far. It is hard to sing of love, joy, hope, and peace, when the heart cries in pain and sorrow.

Grief is all around us. We continue to experience loss upon loss because of the real threat of the ever-evolving COVID. Fatigue and frustration are boiling over in anger and disillusionment. In the midst of this wilderness experience so many also encounter unwanted changes, aging issues, health issues, economic issues, and of course, our greatest enemy, death itself. The burden of these challenges is magnified when culture sings that this is the most wonderful time of the year. As we journey to Bethlehem during Advent, we encounter the unconventional John the Baptist. John the Baptist understood his ministry as a fulfilment of the prophecy of Isaiah, the voice of one crying in the wilderness. His message helps give definition to how we prepare for the coming of God to us – prepare the way of the Lord. This is why

repentance is an Advent theme.

Yet, in John's claiming the mantle of Isaiah, we can also be reminded of how the Isaiah prophecy began:

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God (Isaiah 40:1)

Isaiah spoke of valleys being filled and mountains made low, the crooked made straight and the rough ways made smooth, as John quoted. This is not our doing; it is the work of God who has chosen to come to us in Christ. We can see the salvation of God because of God's steadfast love and faithfulness birthed in a stable, evidenced in love and healing, crucified on a cross, and raised from the grave. It is good to acknowledge our pain and grief in Advent, and to give space to those struggling. The God of strength is moving within us; the God of courage is hearing our distress; the God of hope is revealing wholeness; the God of healing is touching us in our brokenness. God sustains and redeems. In our loneliness and



enness. God sustains and In our loneliness and isolation God is present in love and comfort. You are not alone. We are not alone.

I hope to see you Sundays in December as we continue our journey through Advent.

Let's continue to choose kindness, compassion, and love; let do justice and make peace; let's welcome the stranger; let's persevere in prayer, as we glorify God, grow disciples, and meet the needs of our neighbors.
